**How do you currently support students receiving special education services on your campus?

Students are included in full co-teaching classrooms where two teachers spend the majority of the day/class period together, planning and implementing lessons collaboratively.

Students are included in classrooms where a special education teacher provides support based on the student's IEP for all or part of the class. They may or may not plan/implement the lessons collaboratively.

Students receive instruction in a general education setting for some classes/courses and a special education setting (i.e. resource, content mastery) for others.

Students spend the majority of their day in a self-contained classroom (i.e. behavior or life skills unit) and interact with general education teachers and peers on a minimal basis.

Students receive their special education support by a paraprofessional in a general education setting based on the student's IEP for all or part of the class.
