
What is the percentage **USDA** Entitlement contributes towards your average daily menu?

Entitlement Terms and Definitions

Term	Definition		
Entitlement	Amount of funds available to Recipient Agencies (RA) for requesting USDA Foods. Also known as Entitlement Dollars, Planned Assistance Level (PAL) dollars or commodity dollars.		
Commodity Rate of Assistance	Value of donated food assistance given to states for each lunch served in the NSLP. Entitlement is calculated using the Commodity Rate of Assistance multiplied by the number of lunches served in the previous school year for NSLP.		
Allocation	USDA Entitlement Foods requested by RA and assigned to the RA for delivery by the contracted warehouse. Amount is based on total reimbursable lunches served from the previous year.



Allocation

USDA Entitlement Allocations are:

- ☐ USDA Entitlement Foods requested by Recipient Agencies (RA) and designated to the RA for delivery by the contracted warehouse.
- Amount is based on total reimbursable lunches served from the previous year.

Entitlement Estimates

Entitlement issued by USDA in January to states

☐ Will be adjusted in the fall based on updates on number of lunches served

Distribution, Calculations, Other Costs

Entitlement Distribution

TDA uses the following formula to distribute USDA Entitlement to all participating RAs:

(Published Rate of Assistance posted on SquareMeals)

Associated Costs: Warehouse Fees

RAs are responsible for:

- ☐ Tracking warehouse storage and delivery charges to make the most of entitlement dollars.
- ☐ Using warehouse per case rate to schedule most cost-effective deliveries.
- ☐ Monitoring, tracking, and paying invoices provided by warehouse *on time*.

Warehouse Storage Charges

Warehouse storage fees and dwell time periods vary based on contracted warehouse.

- ☐ Free Storage
- ☐ Short Term Storage Cost
- ☐ Long-Term Storage Cost

*More time in storage = more \$\$\$



Associated Costs: Processing Fees

Associated Costs of Processing in Addition to USDA Foods:

- □ Packaging
- □ Labor
- □ Storage
- □ Delivery
- ☐ Associated costs must be covered with cash coming out of account.

Associated Costs: Processing Procurement Fees

Procurement Fees:

- ☐ Processing USDA Foods must go through procurement process.
- ☐ If vendors procure processed materials for (Recipient Agencies) RAs, vendors fees will have to be paid for staff time used to handle procurement
- ☐ For all other USDA foods, USDA handles procurement on behalf of RAs without fees.

- ☐ List of all processors and products purchased with that processor
- Donated food value with USDA material number banked with processor
- ☐ Usage by Month

Reviewing Warehouse Invoices and Inventory

Tracking Warehouse Invoices and Inventory

CHANGE

Transition to WBSCM includes managing inventory in *warehouse tracking systems*. Tracking systems include, but not limited to:

- □ Ability to review allocations
- □ Review inventory available to order for delivery to the RA
- □ View open delivery orders
- □ Includes BOL (Bill of Lading) and USDA Sales Order numbers



RAs are responsible for:

☐ Monitoring allocation of USDA Foods products and entitlement in WBSCM.

■ Monitoring contracts to ensure full credit for all USDA Food values are received.




Maximize Entitlement #2: USDA Cost Analysis Worksheet







Processing Discounts

Passing On Savings

Processors are required to return full value of USDA Food contained in finished end-products.

- ☐ TDA allows one of the following value passthrough options:
 - □ Net off Invoice discounting the normal commercial price of a product;
 - □ Refund paying a refund to the school
 - ☐ Fee for Service charging a fee for service for converting the USDA Foods. 4

Maximize Entitlement #5:

Bonus

- □ RAs may request as many bonus foods as it can use without waste
- TDA notifies eligible RAs when bonus foods become available
- Not charged against a RAs food entitlement amount



Year At A Glance

☐ January:

- Preparations for a new program year begin.
- Catalogs open in USDA's WBSCM system (Webbased Supply Chain Management) to place requests for foods.

CHANGE

- Contract Packets no longer required for RAs using WBSCM.
- Mark Yes to USDA Foods question in SNP Application to opt-in.

☐ February:

DoD Fresh entitlement allocations distributed.

☐ March:

Annual and processing catalogs close in WBSCM.

Year At A Glance

June: ☐ Warehouse delivery and storage costs are updated on SquareMeals Contracted Warehouse Page under NSLP.

☐ July:

- ☐ USDA announces official or published commodity rate of assistance for next school year.
- ☐ RAs may lose or gain entitlement
