End of Year Alphabet Celebration




- A Apples (Apple Slices), ABC Bings

*The items in italics are **highly recommended** by TEA but not required. The Optional PA items are helpful because they measure the understanding of larger ("easier") parts of PA with Listening & Words in a Sentence, and it also assesses higher level PA with the expressive piece in Rhyming II.

Writing Letter to Pre-K 2023

As a class, write a letter the incoming Pre-K class of 2023. Ask students to think of important things to tell students who will be new to Pre-K in the fall. Start by creating a list of things they would like to tell the students. Turn the list into a letter on chart paper! Talk about the letters you are writing to make up words, the spaces between words, punctuation, return-sweep, etc. Don't forget to have each child sign the letter at the bottom! Read it a few times between now and the end of the year to practice important print-awareness skills. Use it as a transition by asking a child to find a certain letter before moving to the next activity.

Emergent Literacy My Favorite... of Pre-K

Help students create a personal memory book to capture their Pre-K year. Using a sentence stem, have students draw a picture of a favorite for each page. Take some dictation on each page to help complete the story of their favorites and/or encourage them to write some on their own. Complete a page a day and have them create a decorative book cover.

Playdoh Counting Garden





Last Day Blues






The End is Just the Beginning
